1-Ride clarification

How far can you go for your \$1.50, or \$0.75 (discounted)? How far does a single swipe of your pass get you? KAT is attempting to clarify the definition of a trip, or a single ride.

A TRIP on a KAT bus is defined as whichever occurs first: the passenger gets off the bus, or the bus has reached the highest timepoint number shown on the passenger schedule--in most cases, Knoxville Station.

Proposed policy change on interlined transfers

Effective January 2, 2012, a passenger on a bus route that is interlined with another route must purchase a transfer or swipe their pass when their travel involves staying on that bus for the second route.

For example, a passenger on Route 12--Western Avenue who wishes to stay on that same bus to Route 22--Broadway must re-swipe his or her pass or pay a transfer fee when the bus arrives at Knoxville Station and becomes Route 22.
